NOTES FROM ANN

Dear Welsh Government,

I write to you to challenge the proposed cuts to core County Voluntary Council Funding for 2016/17 through the Welsh Government's Third Sector Infrastructure Agreement.

Flintshire Local Voluntary Council is working closely with partners in the Local Authority and Health and Third Sector colleagues to meet the aims of the Social Services and Well Being Act 2014, engaging individuals and communities in seeking and developing more independent approaches to public service delivery and support needs.

At a time when the engagement of volunteers and community groups is most needed, such cuts to ground level support services are counter-productive. Without the protection of our core services, our ability to facilitate and support the more holistic, user-led preventative and cost effective support and services that the Third Sector delivers is devastatingly compromised.

As the Welsh Government is requesting commitment from the Third Sector to explore Alternative Delivery Models for crucial public services, the foundations that exist to develop quality Third Sector services are being decimated.

As an organisation we have developed good relationships with our Local Authority and Health Board partners, offering support to help statutory services to meet the needs of Flintshire residents in a more effective, and cost-effective way. As our core structure becomes more fragile, sadly, our ability to help to enable a change to a more engaged, less dependent society constantly erodes, putting ever increasing pressure back on to statutory services.

Your assistance in challenging this funding strategy would be greatly appreciated.

FUNDING

FOCUS ON WELSH COUNCIL FOR VOLUNTARY ACTION FUNDING

THE ACTIVE INCLUSION FUND

The Active Inclusion fund is managed by Wales Council for Voluntary Action (WCVA) supported by funding from European Structural Funds. It aims to reduce economic inactivity in Wales and improve the employability of disadvantaged people furthest from the labour market.

WCVA, as an Intermediate Body acting on behalf of the Welsh European Funding Office (WEFO), will offer the following areas of funding covering:

- West Wales and the Valleys for over 25s
- East Wales for over 25s

WCVA are also hoping that the following areas of funding will be available shortly:

- West Wales and the Valleys for 16-24s
- East Wales for 16-24s

The fund will work with those who are designated long term unemployed or economically inactive and have complex barriers to employment. Further details can be found in the information sheets which can be downloaded from the 'More Information' section on the right of this page.

Active Inclusion will be delivered through two complementary strands:

Strand 1: Include

Strand 1 activity will focus on engaging those participants furthest from the labour market and will act as a 'first step' in the participants' journey to employment. It will include a

vast range of activities such as basic skills training, volunteering, money management and social skills.

Strand 2: Achieve



Strand 2 will offer paid supported employment opportunities for up to 26 weeks and 35 hours per week. Participants will be paid at least the National Minimum Wage. Activities will include essential skills training, actual work experience, financial management training, and job search.

How much money can Active Inclusion invest in organisations?

Grants will be offered at the following levels:

- Level 1 will offer project grants of up to £25,000 (Strand 1 only)
- Level 2 will offer project grants of between £25,001-£75,000
- Level 3 will offer project grants of between £75,001 - £150,000
- Level 4 will offer project grants of £150,001 - £400,000 (Strand 2 only)

Match funding will be required and will be specified in each grant specification.

SOCIAL INVESTMENT

Social investment is helping the third sector grow by providing access to loan finance not available commercially.

Through WCVA, third sector organisations can access between £1,000 and £5 million - and almost £5 million in finance has already been invested in organisations all over Wales.

WCVA have invested in organisations that are expanding their income-generating activities, their range of services and also organisations that have struggled to attract grant funding for new projects.

WCVA's social investment portfolio includes the following options :

MICRO BUSINESS LOAN FUND

- Partnership with Finance Wales, Credit Unions and Coalfields Regeneration Trust
- All Wales
- Loan size £1,000 to £50,000
- Maximum term 5 years
- Interest rate 10%
- Fee £200



COMMUNITIES INVESTMENT FUND

- Loan size £20,000 to £250,000
- Maximum term 25 years
- Interest rate around 7.5%

PROPERTY LOAN FUND

- Partnership with Unity Trust Bank
- All Wales
- Loan size £250,000 to £5 million
- Maximum term 30 years
- Interest rate currently around 4.5%
- 1.5% fee
- 75% loan to value

RUGBY WORLD CUP LEGACY GRANTS SCHEME 2016

Trustees of the Millennium Stadium Charitable Trust have decided to celebrate the success of the 2015 Rugby World Cup by creating a one off grant scheme called The MSCT World Cup Legacy Grants Scheme in SPORT.

Projects must only be for capital or equipment and must leave a legacy. The organisation applying does not necessarily need to be a sporting organisation but the project must be a sports project requiring capital / equipment funding.

A maximum grant of £5,000 is available to both local and regional projects.

The Grant Scheme will be open until 11th April 2016



VOLUNTEERING STREET ART AT MOLD

AWARDS

COMMUNITY ACTION AWARD WINNERS

North Wales Energy Advice Centre (NWEAC), and their project partners Flintshire County Council, are celebrating after their Affordable Warmth project was named Community Action Award Winner.

The Community Action Awards, which are run by national fuel poverty charity NEA in partnership with the Department of Energy and Climate Change (DECC) and British Gas, recognise excellence and innovation in tackling fuel poverty and improving energy efficiency amongst vulnerable households.

A third of the population in Wales are believed to be living in fuel poverty. Of the approximate 63,781 (2011 Census) households in Flintshire, as many as 21,048 households may be struggling to pay their fuel bills. North Wales Energy Advice Centre are helping to tackle this by providing 'free and impartial' guidance and support on all

aspects of energy use within the home. This may include a full, in-home assessment to identify energy savings, find the best tariff and help to switch supplier. If the household is in fuel debt, negotiate with the energy company to reduce the debt, and help budget for future bills. Where grants are available to implement energy measures such as a new boiler, help with grant applications and/or access crisis funding if the household is living in fuel poverty, or deemed vulnerable and in need.

NWEAC are absolutely thrilled to receive this award, and celebrated earlier this month with a ceremony at the Gronant Institute. The prize fund of £1,500, will be used to kick

start a new Community Hub project designed to reach out to over 3,200 properties within Rural North Flintshire. Rural communities, for a variety of reasons are often disproportionately affected by fuel poverty. Via a combination of mail shots and community engagement events, the project aims to raise awareness of, access to and take-up of vital services. Feedback received will help identify need, gaps in provision, and in turn help influence the direction of this and future projects.

The **THIRD SECTOR DOCTOR** Project is a Big Lottery funded initiative which supports third sector (voluntary, charitable and community) organisations with their governance and operational policies and procedures, enabling them to become more resilient and self-reliant.

The TSD Project has recruited a team of specialist volunteer mentors with a wealth of knowledge, who are able to use their personal experiences to support organisations with specific situations. This is a bespoke service as every organisation has different needs. TSD staff will conduct an initial organisational health-check, which will highlight strong and best practice, along with areas for development, identified in an action plan. As part of this, a mentor would then be able to provide specialist support.

FLINTSHIRE COMMUNITY CHEST UPDATE

Citizens Advice Flintshire (CAF) recently received a Flintshire County Council Community Chest grant of £1000 towards the upgrading of their website which will now enable people in Flintshire to access the CAF services digitally. The new website is being developed to enable them to help more people living in Flintshire by addressing the needs of those people who often need urgent advice on debt, fuel poverty, advice on energy efficiency, welfare benefits, discrimination or other areas affecting people's quality of life.

The new website will enable users to access a more responsive site allowing the user to browse via smartphones and tablet PC's. As more people are using the services of the CAF, they are wanting to ensure that their services are accessible to all. The inclusion of email and webchat will enable new enquiries to come from people in full-

time employment working traditional office hours, disabled people, carers and other groups who currently find it difficult to access the CAF services.

Alongside grants from Western Link, the Westernlink Partners, National Grid and Scottish Power Transmission, the projects construction partners Siemens and Prysmain and The Williams Family Foundation it is hoped that the site will go live later in the year.

HOME LIFE - A CONFERENCE AIMED AT PRACTITIONERS WORKING WITH CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

Play Wales Chwarae Cymru are pleased to invite you to a North Wales conference aimed at improving the home lives of children and their families through an increased understanding and experience of play. The conference will focus on ways in which we might create the conditions for more playful parenting and identify ways of better supporting parents to improve opportunities for playing.

Date : Friday 22nd April OR Saturday 23rd April 2016

Venue : Conwy Business Centre, Llandudno



We have all played and as such we know that in some way it contributed significantly to make us the people we are today. Playing helped us consolidate that which we were taught, play helped compliment that which we were developing, play exposed us to new experiences and was the way we worked through ones we found difficult. Play was the way we built attachments with people and places. Most significantly, through playing, we developed social and emotional intelligence, self-regulation, engaged cognitively and creatively with the world around us and it was fun, motivating and rewarding.

This conference will explore attitudes and approaches to childhood, consider issues around child development and explore notions of play, its role and function. We will identify some of the competing demands and issues that negatively impact on the conditions that could support a more playful home life and ways in

which those demands might be re-balanced.

In February 2013 United Nations Committee on the Rights of the Child published General Comment 17 clarifying the right children have to play, what is meant by the term play and demonstrating the complexities and both immediate and longer term benefits of play. Most worryingly, it presented a comprehensive discussion of a range of competing demands negatively influencing how play is viewed, provided and in turn experienced by children. In July 2014 the Welsh Government introduced a statutory duty on local authorities to secure sufficient play opportunities for children living in their areas. This duty is concerned with increasing and protecting the time, space and permission children have to play throughout all aspects of their lives. As such it is of significant importance that the home, where children

spend the most significant amount of their daily lives and those that support home and family life are appreciative of the nature and benefits of play and are capable of creating the conditions to support it.

This is a free conference and lunch will be provided, however places are initially limited to 15 per county and will be allocated on a first come, first served basis.

THE OLD COURT HOUSE WINS HERITAGE LOTTERY FUND SUPPORT

The Old Court House café in Flint has been awarded a Heritage Lottery Fund grant which has been supported by Flintshire County Council, to provide a wide range of community activities linked with the history of the town.

The property, in Church Street, which is the oldest building in the Flint, except for the Castle, has been developed as a high-end coffee shop and community hub by the Pennaf Housing Group.

The development is a partnership initiative supported by the Flint Townscape Heritage Initiative (THI) – a partnership funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund, CADW, Flint Town Council and Flintshire County Council - and the Heritage Lottery Fund this week announced a £48,200 grant to create a community heritage hub within the building. The grant includes a £7,000 contribution from Flintshire County Council.

"We are absolutely delighted at the grant, which will enable us to progress with a whole range of activities," said Paul Moore, Social Enterprise Officer with Pennaf.

"We will be training staff in the historical aspects of the site and will then work with pupils from Ysgol Gwynedd to create a timeline of the history of the town.

"We'll be able to recruit volunteers of all ages to join us in this vital work, making sure that the Old Court House becomes a central hub, celebrating the whole area. Telling the story of the Old Court House really is something that will involve people across the generations," said Paul who added that the grant will enable a drama specialist and

community support officer to work on the initiative.

"The interpretation centre at the Old Court House will be fully bilingual and as well as the timeline display panels and activity sheets, we will also engage a heritage consultant and storyteller to work with volunteers at the Urdd Eisteddfod in Flint next year."

It's a cracking April ...



CHARITY COMMISSION

- Campaign to launch in January targeting charities in default.
- Filing accounts is key to transparency and public trust in charities.

Despite all charities with income over £25,000 being required to submit accounts, thousands are in default. Excuses received by the commission include: "I don't have access to the internet" [sent via email], "I'm not involved with this charity's requirements, I am a trustee"; and "I already did it...last year".

Flintshire County Council – Withdrawal of Discretionary Rate Relief



FCC has recently launched a review of this Non Domestic Rate (NDR) relief which threatens to remove up to 100% of the current rate relief. Although Charities and CASCs, plus Village Halls and similar, will maintain their 80% Mandatory relief as it is funded centrally. This may, however, make a big difference to the not for profit organisations such as sporting clubs, societies or other organisations who use premises for the purpose of recreational or social welfare. You can check your potential bill by finding the rateable value from the Valuation Office Agency www.voa.gov.uk then multiplying it by the so called annual 'multiplier' which is currently 48.6 for 2016/17 per £.

Employment Allowance up to £3000

Increase in the National Insurance contributions (NICs) employment allowance from £2000 to £3000. From April 2014, every business, charity and community amateur sports club has been entitled to an annual 'employment allowance' to reduce their liability for Class 1 secondary NICs – payable on earnings over £8112pa/£156pw.

And Apprentice NIC reductions too

Similarly from April 2016 employers of apprentices under the age of 25 will no longer be required to pay secondary Class 1 (employer) NICs on earnings up to the Upper Earnings Limit, for those employees.

Living wage!!!!

From April 2016, the Government will introduce a new mandatory National Living Wage (NLW) for workers aged 25 and above, initially set at £7.20 – a rise of 50p relative to the current National Minimum Wage (NMW) rate. That's a £910 per annum increase in earnings for a full-time worker (35hrs) on the current NMW.

Charity Commission

- Nearly one-third of charities' accounts filed of 'unacceptable quality'.





Fe all hyn olygu asesiad arbed ynni o bob agwedd o fywyd y cartref,
