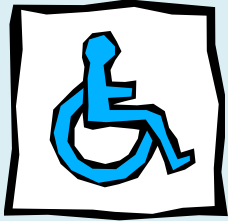


Other Facilities



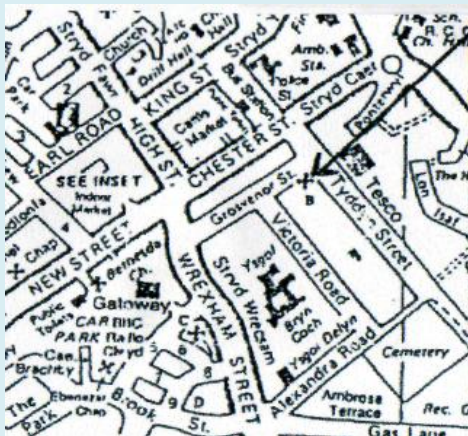
The building has a modern kitchen facility, toilets (which include baby changing provision) and disabled access to all areas.

In June 2012 a new venue is becoming available to the people and businesses of Mold. Following a major re-ordering of the building, five new community spaces have been created which will be ideal for all kinds of activities and events.



Space 1 – The Assembly Room

This is a large area suitable for rehearsals, performances, conferences, etc. There will be seating for up to 80 people. The 'chancel' area is raised 50cm above the seating area (additional staging available) and would be a great room for events such as concerts, plays and conferences.



With modern sound and lighting equipment being made available, events which involve music and/or drama can be rehearsed and performed in the Assembly Room.

It is the intention to provide up-to-date audio-visual equipment, which will make it a good location for business or church conferences and seminars.

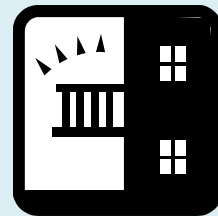


Space 2 – The Upper Room

As the name suggests this room is on the first floor. It is separated from the other rooms in the building and it has its own toilet facility. It will be ideal for children's activities or meetings for up to 30 people. The entrance up to the room is either via the 'feature' staircase or the lift.



The Upper Room overlooks the Assembly Room and the glass screens can be opened so that it can be used in conjunction with that room for larger concerts and conferences. It also has a balcony which overlooks the Assembly Room.



Space 3 – The Meeting Room

This is a small room on the ground floor and could be used for smaller meetings and counselling sessions. The room has a glass wall on one side so it feels part of the main building.



Space 4 – The Narthex

This is the space that links the other rooms together. To one side are the kitchens and toilets so the room could be used for refreshments or as a drop-in area. Because it is the main entrance into the Assembly Room, it could also be used as a display area. Like the Upper Room, the Narthex has a screen which opens into the Assembly Room and can be used for additional seating for events taking place in there.



Space 5 - Office

There will be an additional office which will make an alternative room for small meetings.
